Question/s to be Answered

I am requesting the following information under the Freedom of Information Act:

1. Do you collect data on:
  - a. The number of children (aged 5-15) and adults (aged 16-64) within your health board with an ADHD diagnosis

Yes, within Children's Outpatient Department and CAMHS, although we cannot guarantee completeness of the data as children may have been diagnosed and discharged from the caseload, so not showing on the current data. I would expect this to be the case for only 1 or 2 children.

Yes, with the Community Mental Health Team, data is collected on adults within their notes.

- b. The number of children (aged 5-15) and adults (aged 16-64) within your health board awaiting ADHD assessment/diagnosis

Yes, as above

- c. The number of children (aged 5-15) and adults (aged 16-64) within your health board receiving pharmacological treatment/medication for their ADHD

Yes within CMHT notes and also Pharmacy/Primary Care as not all ADHD treatment is provided in CMHT

- d. The number of children (aged 5-15) and adults (aged 16-64) within your health board receiving non-pharmacological ADHD support services

No, we do not hold this data for children nor adults. The majority of the non-pharmacological ADHD support services are provided by education department from the local authority.
